BCHS Student Identification Badge Policy

All students at Boulder City High School are required to wear an identification badge while on all CCSD campuses. The badge is to ensure that students can be identified for school safety purposes. Each badge will list the student's name, ID number, school, grade, information for SafeVoice - an anonymous reporting system used to report threats for the safety and well-being of students, and the National Suicide Prevention Hotline phone number.

Students are required to wear an identification badge starting on the first day of school, August 11th. We recommend students wear an old school ID until they receive their 2025-2026 identification badge on Picture Day (Seniors: August 13th and Underclass: August 20th). BCHS lanyards will be provided to all students on Picture Day.

Frequently Asked Questions

What if I forget to wear my Identification Badge?
If the student does not have their ID, they will be given a sticker badge to wear for that day.

What if I lose my Identification Badge?
Students will receive up to two free badges. If the student continues to lose their ID, the reprinting of the badge will be \$5 for each replacement.

What do I wear the first two weeks of school?
According to CCSD policy, students must wear an ID badge starting on August 11th. Students are recommended to wear an old school ID. They may bring their IDs to the Soaring Through BCHS event or to the front office where staff will hole punch an old student badge (if not already hole punched) and students will receive a temporary lanyard.

Do I have to wear my Identification Badge at after-school events?
Yes, students are required to wear IDs at all after-school events at CCSD properties- this includes football games, basketball games, etc. If students do not have their ID, they will be given a sticker badge to wear at the event.

Can I wear any type of lanyard?

Yes, all students will receive a BCHS lanyard, but they may wear their own.

Progressive Discipline:

Violation of the Student Identification Badge Policy will result in progressive discipline ranging from Minor to Major resolutions. Minor to Major behavior incident resolution determinations involve an analysis of repeated incidents or violation of the CCSD Student Code of Conduct. Major resolutions involve frequency of occurrence and the historical interventions provided to the student by school personnel. A Major disciplinary outcome for insubordination will automatically result if a student refuses to wear the identification badge or the temporary badge sticker.
